


What could "underperforming" look like for you?

- Not achieving your all-important grades to get onto your desired course next year. E.g. Grade 6s for A levels/Lv 3
- Not passing both English and Maths, the Colleges will ask you to take a function skills or a re-sit course for the whole year. It may mean you also miss out on studying your first-choice pathway.
- You don't get enough passes overall to start your course and you may have to go back to a lower Level 2 course, which is nothing like what you want to do.








What are the "Red Lines" for all Exams

- You must place your valuables into your locker, we cannot look after your bags





1. Check WHAT you need to revise

Use the revision guide. Red / Amber / Green it, then go ahead revise, starting with the red.

2. Content

Do you know the facts / content / methods. Summarise, read and learn the main ideas.

3. Practice the exam questions

What does the question want from you? Take time to work it out...highlight key words and command word.

- Go to subject support sessions






